

# PIANO MAKEOVER CHECKLIST

## SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- Paint
- Drop Cloth
- Stencil
- Contrasting Paint Color
- Various Paint Brushes

## 6 TIPS:

1. If you are using chalk paint, no sanding is required. You can start applying your base coat over top of the finish of the piano.
2. Paint all of the nooks and crannies of the piano. There are more than you would think.
3. Close the key cover and paint the surface in the event you want to close the cover.
4. Depending on the size of the piano and the type of legs, take a step back from different angles to make sure that you painted all surfaces.
5. I did not paint the undercarriage of the baby grand. It just wasn't worth it to me. You get to decide for your project.
6. After the paint has dried, you can add stencils of any motifs to add embellishment to your piano. I like to use a contrasting paint type and color to make the design pop.
